

Giving to the Philadelphia Museum of Art through a Foundation or Donor Advised Fund

Many Associates and Chairman’s Council donors choose to give to the Philadelphia Museum of Art through a charitable foundation or a donor advised fund. According to IRS regulations, donors may not receive any tangible benefits or services in exchange for the grant from their foundation or donor advised fund.

In these situations, the museum can offer basic benefits that carry no tangible value. These available benefits include:

- Dedicated staff member to assist with all of your museum needs
- Invitations to exhibition openings
- Recognition on the museum’s donor plaque and in other donor lists
- Family programs to engage the kids in your life
- Exclusive receptions and visit to private homes and collections (Chairman’s Council Member and above)
- Exclusive complimentary day trip (Chairman’s Council Member and above)
- Complimentary access to any and all public programs offered by the museum (Chairman’s Council Patron and above)

If you prefer to receive the full range of available goods and services associated with the gift level you choose, including VIP passes for ticketed exhibitions, you may make a personal payment to purchase the value of benefits at cost. Please note that the personal payment amount cannot be subtracted from the foundation or donor advised fund grant amount—bifurcated payments are not allowed.
